The exam will be based upon the Core Curriculum of EMS available on the ABEM website. **Will you be ready?**

Many of us are going to need to do a comprehensive review of the material to be successful with the subspecialty exam. As a service to its members, NAEMSP® and ACEP have come together to sponsor a review course covering the entire core curriculum of EMS. The material has been prepared by and will be presented by faculty well known to the EMS community, selected for their breadth of knowledge and experience as well as their communication skills.

The format of the review course will be in-person, spanning sixteen hours in three days.

Day 1 1 p.m. – 6 p.m.

Day 2 8 a.m. – 6 p.m.

Day 3 8 a.m. – Noon

The outlined schedule is in keeping with one of the goals of the course, which is to make this as convenient and affordable to the participants as possible.
