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

- 39. What resources will be used to create the EMS certification exam? The EMS certification examination is based on the Core Content of EMS Medicine. In addition, the knowledge, training, and practice experience of the minimally qualified EMS subspecialty candidate has been defined, and also serves as a foundation for the EMS certification exam.
- 40. What topics will be covered on the EMS certification examination? The EMS certification examination is a comprehensive exam covering the breadth of the field of Emergency Medical Services. The Core Content of EMS Medicine froms the basis of the exam. The list below describes the relative weight given to different elements of the Core Content of EMS Medicine in constructing the EMS multiple choice certification exam.

Clinical Aspects of EMS Medicine
Medical Oversight of EMS 30%
Quality Management and Research
Special Operations 10%
