Diverse Groups / Diverse Needs

- Ensure system and provider awareness
- Identify special populations in your jurisdiction
 - -Anticipate needs
 - -Investigate existing strategies
 - -Work with groups / local resources





Disasters

- A challenging situation becomes more challenging
 - -Evacuation
 - Lack of electricity
 - -Home oxygen, medications, pets, shelter, etc...
- Strategies
 - -GIS mapping of patients with special needs
 - -Pre-Plan
 - -Consider shelter in place
 - -Stage resources





Potential Test Questions

 - -Groups whose needs may not be fully met by traditional service providers and standard resources

 - -Providers may lack, equipment, sensitivity, knowledge
